

began. Honourees get to enjoy a day at the IPM with a complimentary lunch. They also receive a family photo shoot and a commemorative sign to hang on their farm gate.






Lasby says the future of the program looks bright.




IPM 2022 TENTED CITY MAP



KEMPTVILLE CAMPUS: A THRIVING HUB

A community nexus rooted in agriculture

Kemptville Campus is excited to welcome the International Plowing Match and Rural Expo (IPM), who have leased the space for the event this year. This historic 626-acre property is home to 17 buildings, woodlands, cropland, wetland, green space and green houses, an agro-forestry centre, maple bush, and trails.

The Municipality of North Grenville purchased the Campus from the Agricultural Research Institute of Ontario in 2018. Since then, the Campus has become a thriving community hub and educational centre.

North Grenville Mayor Nancy Peckford was instrumental in the purchase of the land and an enthusiastic advocate for the campus. She served as interim chair of the board in her capacity as mayor before passing the torch to Karen Cooper and an independently run board.

"It's an incredible asset to have 626 acres, and our vision for the Campus is to support the agricultural sector and its diversity in Eastern Ontario," Peckford explains. "The campus remains a hub for educational training, and it's a community space that can be well-utilized in our city and beyond."

"Campus stakeholders have done a tremendous job of pivoting from the time of closure, and they've reinvented themselves," says former executive director and project manager Patricia Remillard.

"This is a really exciting juncture," Remillard says. "As we've evolved into an education and community centre with very specific objectives, I think we're at a point where the campus gaining some serious traction and securing its future. There's a strong chair, strong executive director... everyone is committed to the project moving forward."





Liz Sutherland was named the current executive director of Kemptville Campus on Jan. 10, 2022. Sutherland has 25 years of experience working with policy and programs in the non-profit and public sectors and will lead the development of business, strategic, operational, educational, funding, and communication plans for the Campus.

Kemptville Campus is a place for families to learn and grow. Some 500 children attend school on site between four major school districts - English, French, Catholic, and public. There are three daycares on site, a mixture of for-profit and not-for-profit government agencies, and facilities for applied research.

The campus adheres to the site's strong agricultural history and offers a variety of ways to learn about farming.

"We want to support experiential awareness and exposure learning for the younger grades," Remillard says. "We support special ag, environment, food, horticulture, forestry, and other innovation programs. For post-secondary students, we expand apprenticeship opportunities within the region. We started this with a special diesel and mechanic apprenticeship program."

"This is a way for Kemptville Campus to offer crucial agricultural training that's so



important to the region and to the industry overall," Peckford adds.

"The campus, admin, board, and municipality are all deeply committed to supporting agriculture just as the campus has done for the past 100 years," Remillard says. "Realizing the vision for the agri-food ecosystem in addition to our four-board collaboration gives us a unique opportunity to ensure students are aware of where their food comes from and offer them the availability to participate in awareness, entrepreneurship, and innovation programs. We hope this will ignite and excite their future in agri-food."

The campus is a site for a variety of events that bring the community together and empower local businesses.

"Since we've taken over the space. it's been the site of a very large music festival (Kemptville Live) and we host several different community events. We

hosted a number of night markets where local food producers and 100s of people from around Eastern Ontario could sell in a COVID-safe environment," Peckford explains. "The old cafeteria was taken over by a local caterer. She hosts weddings, conferences, and many other regional and community events, and she's able to feature a bunch of local products and foods."

Since 2018, several of the campus's natural resources and trails have been restored for visitors to enjoy.

"We recognized how important it was to re-open the trails that had fallen dormant," Peckford says. "They've been re-signed and actively maintained in partnership with some of the organizers of Kemptville Live. We were able to host Maple Fest at the sugarbush and invited people to see how reverse osmosis worked and how maple syrup was produced."

Kemptville College is pleased to be welcoming the IPM, with Peckford referring to having the event as a "once-in-a-lifetime opportunity." Some 700 volunteers have been working hard to prepare the city for the show.

"We want to give everyone the warmest welcome. Our beautification contest is going very well across private and commercial properties, and we've printed 500 lawn signs to say 'North Grenville welcomes the IPM to Kemptville College.'"

"There's a lot to look forward to and a lot of excitement in our community," Peckford says. "We're very proud and excited - having the IPM takes the cake in creating this momentum for our campus!"

a digital ticketing program was key. The IPM has had online tickets for several years and have been accepting debit and credit at the gates since 2016, so we were well positioned for the increased interest in online sales." The result has become a major advantage as lines can now move more quickly and people can purchase tickets at their leisure and in their preferred method.

With the changes and advantages there are also challenges. Even with the world returning to normal, or at least a new normal, the trade show industry must remain health and regulation conscious. While this is obviously important regardless of a pandemic having ever-fluid regulations means event organizers must remain prudent to abide by all local and national regulations. As an event we must also account for the people's desire for things such as increased sanitizers and mask availability which must be factored into the logistical plan of any high-quality event.

In her blog post It's Time for A Trade Show 101 Refresher Course, Jo-Ann McArthur reminds exhibitors "to plan ahead, bring samples, and actively engage with show attendees" because while the extra logistical planning does require more work hours it all works out in the end as the biggest advantage in a post-COVID world is the public's want and need to get out, socialize, and see the world around them. Combining this increased desire for interaction with an increased role by sponsors and exhibitors you get a symbiotic relationship that is truly beneficial to all parties.

In the end, the events world wants to get back to seeing the people as much as the people want to get back to seeing events. And as a collaborative group we will face the adversities and advantages of this new world together.

Charles and Rosemary Bennett are the owners of the property and the host family for the IPM. They farm alongside their son and daughter-in-law, Zachary and Kirstan Bennett.

"Our main enterprise is dairy, and we cash crop," explains Charles Bennett.

The Bennetts operate a dairy farm. They have 610 holsteins, with 285 milking at all times. They grow corn, soybeans, fall rye and alfalfa.

The farm was originally purchased by Charles's parents in 1955 when it was 100 acres. Since Charles returned home to farm in 1976, Rideauside Farms has increased to 1,700 acres with 1,400 of that being tillable.

Charles and Rosemary both came from farming backgrounds.

"I've been farming all my life," Charles says. "I've pretty much always known I was going to be a farmer, and it's treated me well. Rosemary married into the farming life, but her family came from agriculture, too."

Zachary and Kirstan, who live nearby, help look after the dairy herd and breeding management. Kirstan handles the human resources and staffing. The Bennetts are joined by eight or nine full- or part-time staff.

Charles says that their farm's prominent positioning along a major artery makes it a great location for the IPM. The farm is 8 KM west of Kemptville on County Rd. 43. They have offered up a large field that's sandy loam with few stones.

The family is excited to host the event and has been working hard to cultivate the proper stubble in the field for the plowing match.

OVSGA - 95 YEARS OF AG IN THE VALLEY



The Ottawa Valley Seed Growers Association is the founding organization and host of the annual Ottawa Valley Farm Show. OVSGA is a not-for-profit entity rich in history and with deep valley roots.

In 1927, after the First World War, a group of Ottawa Valley farmers banded together to form the OVSGA to help one another merchandise their field crops. More than 300 exhibits at the first Seed Fair at Renfrew Collegiate were auctioned and shipped by train to their ultimate destinations. Introduction of new and better varieties, merchandizing of increased production, and continual updating of agricultural information were founding Seed Fair objectives and continue to drive the seed show's modern rendition.

The Seed Fair became an annual event, rotating throughout Eastern Ontario and Western Quebec, between the home communities of OVSGA presidents. It eventually developed into a Championship Show, with exhibitors competing at county shows for the opportunity to bring entries to the next level. Over time, equipment and trade show components were added, eventually growing the event into the Ottawa Valley Farm Show. In 1959, the Show settled into Lansdowne Park in Ottawa, where it remained until moving in 2012 to its current location each March at Ottawa's EY Centre.

The Ottawa Valley Farm Show proudly boasts its seed show roots, displaying the Court of Honour at the centre of the show. The Court of Honour showcases winning entries of the Ottawa Valley Championship Seed, Feed and Forage Show, along with 4-H field crop and life skills exhibits.

OVSGA is dedicated to the local agricultural community, supporting 4-H and youth activities, seed shows, agricultural education initiatives, future seed and crop judges and research. A scholarship program, now in its 6th year, has presented almost \$50,000 to local youth planning to pursue a career in agriculture.

Jeff Waldroff, current OVSGA President and North Stormont dairy farmer, is "proud to work with the dedicated volunteer team of Directors committed to OVSGA and our agricultural community."


