



Program

The International Plowing Match and Farm Machinery Show is one of the premier agricultural showcases in North America. It attracts some of the best plowmen from around the world and is one of the largest farm machinery shows on the continent.

The Ontario Plowmen's Association, in co-operation with the many county plowmen's associations in the province, has sponsored the International Plowing Match and Farm Machinery Show since 1913. The Match is held annually in a different county or region of Ontario and attracts more than 150 competitors from across Canada. This year the plowmen will be competing for more than \$35,000 in prize money.

This year's Match site covers the John Lowe and Family farm and neighbouring farmlands in the heart of some of the finest agricultural land in Ontario. The site is two miles west of the Town of Meaford on County Road 12. Approximately 800 acres have been set aside for the competition fields, the demonstration area and the Tented City.


Plowing is not the only item of interest in this gigantic undertaking. Over 500 exhibits feature the latest in farm machinery, seeds, chemicals, services and new technology. There are also parades, exhibits and demonstrations of the latest in cars, appliances, houses and other consumer products.

The Tented City houses more than 40 caterers who will cook mountains of food to satisfy thousands of hungry visitors. They'll provide everything from the humble hotdog to full-course homemade meals.

Grey County is one of the largest counties in Ontario with a land mass of nearly 1,800 square miles. As an agricultural leader, Grey County raises more sheep than any other county in the province. The 7,000 acres of apple orchards along Georgian Bay make Grey County the single largest apple-producing county in the province, providing one quarter of Ontario's apples. In addition to housing the most cow/calf herds in Ontario, Grey County has more farm separated cream enterprises than any county in the province.

The 54,000 residents of Grey County enjoy natural scenery unmatched in southern Ontario. The majestic Niagara Escarpment provides excellent hiking and skiing. The rolling country, forests, streams, and sparkling shores of Georgian Bay have made Grey County a favourite with tourists from major urban centres, a mere two-hour drive away.
