Match Site

- The site of the 1989 International Plowing Match and Farm Machinery Show was selected in 1986. Detailed plans for exhibitor space, display areas and plowing fields took three years to complete. Nearly 800 acres of land will be used at the Match to provide parking, display space and competition fields.
- The Match is easy to find. It's located 8 miles east of the City of Windsor. If you are coming from the east, follow Highway #401 and take the Belle River/Puce Exit. If you are travelling from the United States, take I-75 to the tunnel or bridge and follow the signs to the parking areas located on the western, eastern and southern boundaries of the site.

Parking and Traffic

Approximately 300 acres of land have been set aside for free parking for the 10,000 cars expected on the Match site each day. With an anticipated attendance of over 100,000 people, traffic control is a major challenge. The Ontario Provincial Police and the local organizing committee have posted direction signs on all routes to the site.

- Massey-Ferguson International Media Challenge Competition: Media personalities from both sides of the border test their plowing skills. Last held in 1969, the international tradition continues.

Essex County Exhibit

- The 1989 Essex County Host Committee invites everyone to "Take a Gander" at our exhibit. With five tents in all, this will be the largest county exhibit in the history of the show.
- A first at the County Exhibit will be the Industrial Tent, which will highlight the broad range of industry in our area. We have food processing, plastics, robotics, engineering, fishing, automotive parts and manufacturing companies represented.
- The Municipalities and Associations Tent will bring together twenty municipalities plus Pelee Island, Canada's southernmost township. The County of Essex and local groups and organizations are pleased to give you an overall view of our county.
- "Jenny," a Belgian mare, is the Essex
 County IPM mascot and will be one of the
 attractions in the Agricultural Tent. Along
 with Jenny we have three breeds of heavy
 horses as well as swine, sheep, poultry,
 beef and dairy cattle. Greenhouse produce,
 vegetables, fruit, honey, mushrooms,
 flowers, grains and farm organizations
 round out the agricultural display.
- Education and health play an important role in our lives. Our schools and health organizations have provided us with examples that demonstrate our excellence in these fields. A visit to the Education & Health Tent will be time well spent.
- Last but not least, the City of Windsor is an integral part of Essex County. The city will be showcased in its own tent, with a variety of exhibits ranging from tourist attractions to the University of Windsor. The "City of Roses" welcomes you!

Special Events

- For the first time at an international level, the 1989 International Plowing Match will include a Conservation Tillage Competition. The competition will take place Wednesday, September 20th, and is being sponsored by the Essex County Soil & Crop Improvement Association, the Ontario Ministry of Agriculture and Food and the Essex Region Conservation Authority.
- Each day of the Match, we will have a main attraction, which will feature such things as a Horse Show, a professional Grape Stomp, a Horseshoeing Demonstration, a Mini-Tractor Pull and the Horseshoe Pitching Tournament. Watch for the signs indicating times and locations for each event.
- There will be a variety of entertainment at Bridgen Square throughout the week. Some of the special attractions will be: The Border City Cloggers, Sweet Adelines as well as a magician and banjo players. There will also be motif painting, clowns, Boblo Island animal characters, and of course a Scottish bag piper.

The 'Just for Children' child care centre, located adjacent to the Family Focus tents, is available daily for children 2 1/2 years (toilet trained) to 7 years and is sponsored by Family Focus and the Ministry of Community and Social Services. This area will provide a comfort station for parents to feed and change babies. It will also care for lost children.

International Plowing Match and Farm Machinery Show

- The International Plowing Match and Farm Machinery Show is one of the premier agricultural showcases in North America. It attracts some of the best plowmen from across the province and is one of the largest farm machinery shows on the continent.
- The Ontario Plowmen's Association, in cooperation with the many county plowmen's associations in the province, has sponsored the International Plowing Match and Farm Machinery Show since 1913. The Match is held annually in a different Ontario county and attracts more than 150 competitors. This year, the plowmen will be competing for more than \$35,000 in prize money.
- This year's Match site is located on Hi-Way Farms Inc. owned and operated by Richard Pogue and Frank Little as well as neighboring farms in the most southern county of the province. Approximately 800 acres have been set aside for the competition fields, the demonstration area and the Tented City.
- Over 600 exhibits feature the latest in farm machinery, seeds, chemicals, services and new technology. There are also parades, exhibits, and demonstrations of the latest in cars, appliances, houses and consumer products.
- The Tented City houses more than 50 caterers who will cook mountains of food to satisfy thousands of hungry visitors. They will provide everything from hot dogs or hamburgers to full-course homemade meals.

Essex Agriculture

- Well known as the "Sun Parlour of Canada", Essex County, Ontario is probably the most intensive and diversified cash crop farming area in Canada. The annual farm value of field, fruit, vegetable and greenhouse crops and livestock produced in the county has been more than \$200 million for several years.
- Essex is the most southern county in Canada. It extends below the 42nd parallel, which forms the northern boundary of the State of California. With the exception of a few gravel ridges, the topography of the county is very flat. There are many soil types in Essex County ranging from heavy clays to light sands.
- The largest area of clay soils around McGregor, Oldcastle, Essex, Woodslee, Belle River, Staples and Comber, produces excellent crops of grain corn, soybeans and winter wheat. In contrast, a smaller area of light textured soils which includes the Leamington, Kingsville and Harrow districts is well adapted for the production of horticultural crops such as tomatoes, potatoes, cabbage, cucumbers, peppers, apples, peaches and grapes. There is also an area of muck soils south of Leamington on Point Pelee where onions, carrots and other vegetables are grown.
- Leamington is the largest and most intensive greenhouse vegetable growing area in Canada with about 300 acres under glass or plastic. This represents about half of the total greenhouse area in the province of Ontario. Essex County greenhouses produce tomatoes, cucumbers and flowers such as mums and roses. The total of all Essex greenhouse crops is valued at more than \$60 million.

We cannot overlook the value of Essex County's \$20 million livestock, milk and poultry output. Nearly 350,000 acres of farm land provide the base for this primary industry. The raw products provide hundreds of jobs at vegetable processing plants, vegetable packing sheds, distilleries, frozen food plants, grain elevators and wineries. Essex County is an important foodland area of Ontario.

Essex County — Breaking New Ground

- The location of Essex County as Canada's most southern land base and the fact that we are bordered by the United States on three sides gives this county a distinctly different character from the rest of Ontario.




